Philadelphia Classical School is excited to announce our fourth graduating class, which includes our very first kindergarteners - the Class of 2026!

Philadelphia Classical School is an independent, co-educational school that serves children in grades K–12 from the Greater Philadelphia area. Since its founding in 2013 with only 20 students, Philadelphia Classical School has added one new grade each year. Today, PCS is an established institution with over 200 students that seeks to provide a classical education through rigorous, liberal arts coursework with a Christian worldview.

Curricular & Pedagogical Distinctives:

- All students are required to complete the same core courses in six subject areas by the time they graduate, which includes 7 honors-level courses. The core emphasizes classical language, the Great Books, mathematics, and natural sciences.
- All students complete required capstone projects in each grade. Seniors
 complete a year-long senior thesis, which can be taken for college credit, on a
 topic of their choosing as the culmination of the rhetoric curriculum.
- Students study the humanities in 90-minute daily honors courses called Humane Letters. These courses utilize Socratic seminars to discuss the Great Books, primary sources, theology, history, art, and philosophy of a time period.
- All science courses **incorporate laboratory experimentation and careful scientific argumentation** in lab reports and presentations.
- Students study Latin from 3rd Grade through 10th Grade, with more advanced courses being offered after Latin IV. Upper School students read and translate primary sources (Cicero, Virgil, and others) from the original Latin with ease.
- With an academic course load that is heavier in volume and rigor than those at peer schools, students develop virtue and time-management skills to fulfill their responsibilities.

Co-Curricular Distinctives:

- The House Leadership Program provides students the opportunity to serve in a student government role by organizing events, developing strategic planning skills, and cultivating a healthy team culture with their peers. Weekly responsibilities for house leaders can rise above 6 hours per week.
- All students participate in the House Program, which is intentionally designed to
 foster community across 7th-12th grades. Students participate in a yearly Upper
 School retreat, academic and athletic competitions, and hands-on, student-led,
 community-building events.
- All students are required to participate in the annual Spring Musical, either as an actor or another contributing member of the tech team or live band.
- All students are required to be in a musical ensemble starting in Kindergarten. Featured Upper School ensembles include choirs (for both Rhetoric and Logic schools) and a strings chamber ensemble. All PCS students learn to play strings instruments beginning in 1st Grade.


